More than 100 countries sign up to develop national strategies for transforming food systems

Ahead of September's Food Systems Summit, more than half of the UN's Member States have pledged to host Dialogue events to begin conversations about improving food systems.

April 26, NAIROBI – More than 100 countries will be shaping their futures in the coming five months and developing pathways to the food systems they need, in line with the universally agreed Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which set out expectations for the state of the world in 2030.

- 126 countries have (integrated) national pathways
- 155 have national food systems convenors
- Overarching frameworks that explicitly set out integrated food (system) policy efforts across an administration's sectors, possibly in interaction with broader governance networks. (Cf. Candel, 2019)

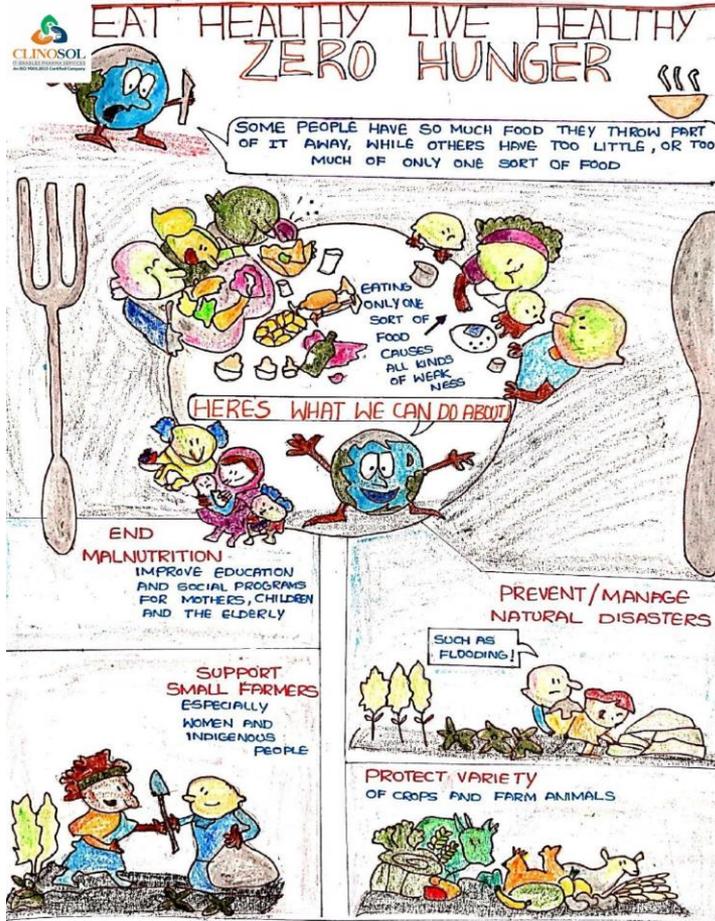

- Policy discrepancies in practice

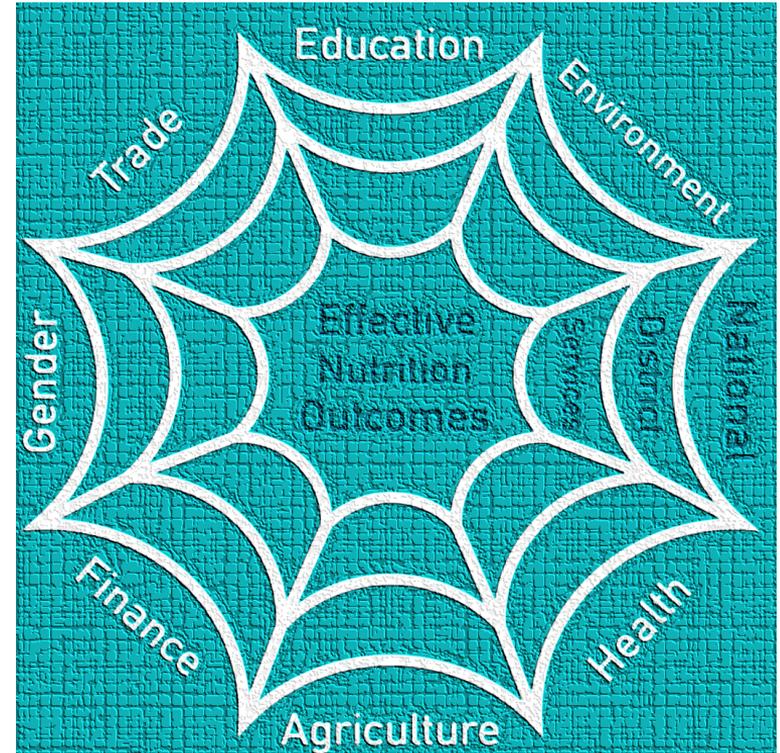
Common visioning/framing nutrition



- Ambiguous framing of nutrition
- Coexistence of competing frames in same context
- Reinterpretation at different governance level, reducing legitimacy

Organise horizontal and vertical policy integration

- Connect policy goals with concrete policy actions
 - *Policy dimensions shift at different paces, varied directions*
- Coherence across governance levels, regions
- Understand conditions determining integration



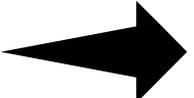

Increased integration

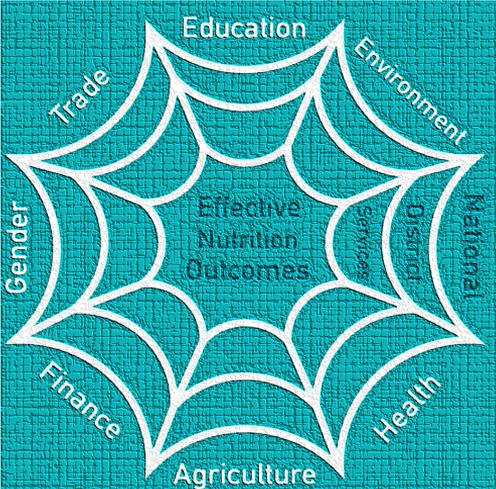
International policy promotion by donors



Issue promotion by civil servants

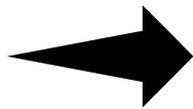

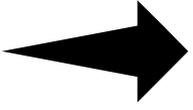

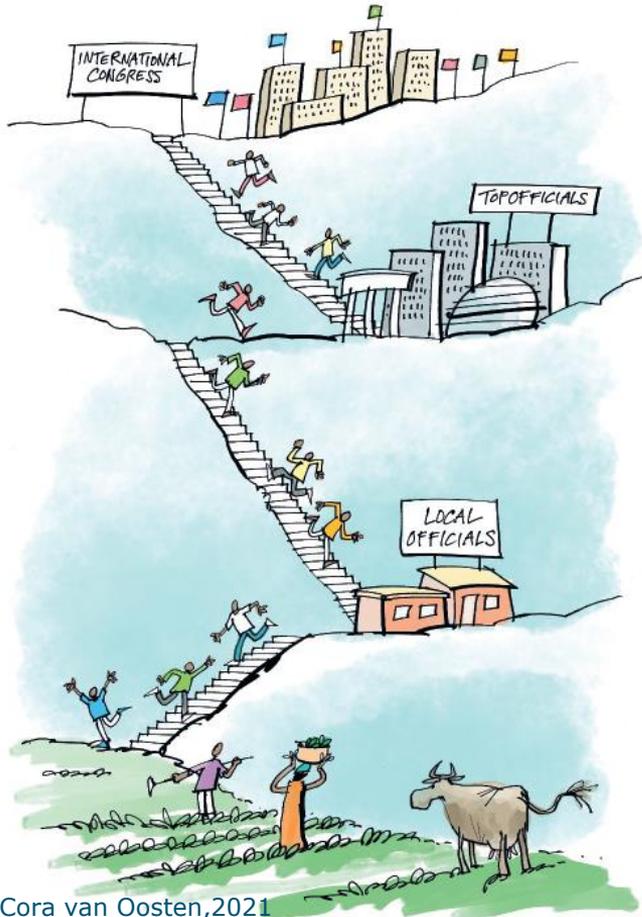

Go beyond the paper policies



- Street level bureaucrats (re)developed integrative policy during implementation
 - Bundling services, Ritual task performance
 - Down prioritisation, Non-involvement
- Leadership and resource allocation are key
- Bottom-up governance reshapes national outcomes

Going beyond paper policies

- Capacitate agency of food system stakeholders -> invest in technical and functional
- Boundary spanning actors important in navigating technical, sector and spatial boundaries
- Adaptability and responsiveness to uncertainties and volatile pressures supports transformation
